# Giraffe

- The giraffe is the tallest mammal on the planet. The giraffe is difficult to hunt because it has thick, tough skin, and its heart is in the center of the chest. You could try to shoot it in the lungs, which are forward and high in the chest.





# Elephant

- The elephant is the largest land mammal in the world. It might be quite irritating if you hunt this animal, because you have to walk many miles to find an elephant. When you hunt an elephant you need a 0.375 caliber gun. A normal distance when you shoot an elephant is probably 20 or 30 yards.



# Kudu

- If you want to hunt a kudu, you need to go in the early morning or the late afternoon. When you go hunting for a kudu bring a group, because they travel in groups of 6 to 12. The horns length is 45 to 60 inches. A heart or lung shot is probably the best decision when hunting a kudu.





# Zebra

- Zebras usually travel in herds of 8 to 10 zebras. The lion is the zebras main predator. Zebras are always alert and are ready to fight at any time. A 0.270 caliber would be considered for this animal. Shot placement is important, so you need to put your shot in the heart or lung area.



# Lion

- This big cat can weigh up to 500 pound  
When hunting the lion be alert, because they can cover 100 yards in 3 to 4 seconds!  
The proper gun to use is a 0.375 caliber.  
The lion is more of a one-shot animal, because if you miss the deadly animal, he will charge right for you.
